You are reminded that the Clean Water Fund MBE/WBE requirements are not applicable to this approval while this agreement remains below \$100,000.00. On contracts greater than \$100,000.00 the goal for participation by subcontractors is 3.0% of the total approved contract amount for Minority Owned Business Enterprises (MBEs), and 3.0% of the total approved
